**SCOTTSDALE, AZ – February 12, 2010** - The Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Scottsdale will honor its 2010 Youth of the Year candidates at its annual Celebrate Youth Dinner & Auction on Saturday, March 20, 2010, at the Scottsdale Resort & Conference Center. The annual gala includes a dinner, silent and live auction, paddler raiser, and live entertainment by Club members. The highlight of the evening will be the naming of the 2010 *Youth of the Year* – the highest honor given to members of the organization.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of America’s *Youth of the Year* program is a premier character and leadership initiative which has been in existence for more than 60 years. Recipients of the award are chosen based on each candidate’s demonstration of moral character, life goals, leadership, poise, public speaking ability and service to the Club, community and family. This year, eight Club members will vie for the distinction of being named *Youth of the Year*. This year’s candidates are:

The 2010 Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Scottsdale Youth of the Year will continue on to the state-level competition with other organizations from across Arizona. The state finalist will be announced during the Arizona State Youth of the Year Legislative Breakfast to be held on April 13, 2010, at the Sheraton Downtown. The winner of the state competition advances to the Pacific Region Youth of the Year competition held later this year, with the opportunity to continue to the national event.
